Who Is Eligible?

- ❑ At least 90 days of active duty
- ❑ Must have served at least ONE DAY during a declared state of war
 - ❑ Veteran DID NOT have to see combat
- ❑ Preferred honorable discharge
 - ❑ Veteran must have any discharge other than dishonorable
- ❑ Surviving spouse must have been married to veteran at the time of death
 - ❑ Surviving spouse cannot remarry to remain eligible unless she remarried a Veteran.

Periods of War

<u>War or Conflict</u>	<u>Beginning and Ending Dates</u>
World War II	12/7/1941 - 12/31/1946
Korean Conflict	06/27/1950 - 01/31/1955
Vietnam Era	2/28/1961 - 05/07/1975 8/15/1964 - 5/7/1975
Gulf War	8/2/1990 through a date to be set by law or Presidential Proclamation

Maximum Pension Rates (2020)

Surviving Spouse of a Veteran	\$14,742.00 Annually
Single Veteran	\$22,939.00 Annually
Married Veteran	\$27,195.00 Annually
Two Veterans Married to each other	\$36,387.00 Annually
